Conference Brief



The 2022 National Social Cohesion and Inclusion Conference will be the fourth annual conference hosted by the Australian Baha'i Community. These conferences aim to be an ongoing space to explore the various settings, approaches, and methods that help to foster greater social cohesion and inclusion in Australia. They are opportunities for those who are thinking deeply about the progress of our country to deliberate, learn, share ideas and reflect on experience.

This year's conference will begin by honouring and celebrating the thousands of well-wishers of humanity who came together at more than 85 of The World Conferences in Australia to deliberate on the material, social and spiritual progress of our country and steps to traverse the obstacles impeding social cohesion. Individuals and community representatives from every part of Australia, of all religions, cultures, ages and

backgrounds, share a longing to foster social cohesion, unity and contribute to the betterment of the world. Their determination and strong sense of purpose are reflected in the spirit generated at these conferences, hosted by local Baha'i communities across Australia.

A report capturing their insights, hopes, noble aspirations, and unity of vision and action will be formally presented to the representatives of the Australian government at the opening reception. This will be followed by cultural and artistic performances celebrating our cohesion, diversity and the oneness of humanity.

The remaining sessions of the conference will include keynote presentations, panels and small group consultations where civil society leaders and representatives will deliberate further on this report and consult on steps to strengthen social cohesion. Themes for this year include:

- A vision of social cohesion in Australia
- The distance traversed to strengthen social cohesion: Community, Mass Media and Government Institutions
- Obstacles impeding further progress
- Glimpses of Social Transformation: Traversing obstacles to social cohesion – experiences from organisations and communities of practice.

Since 2019, these conferences have aimed to systematically build upon themes and ideas introduced by speakers and panellists from the previous ones. The programs have been designed to respond to contemporary issues pertinent to advancing the national discourse on social cohesion. The 2019 conference focused on Indigenous values and ethics; the need for a collective vision for the future; the experiences of those at the grassroots; and the role of the media.

Last year, presenters looked at issues on the role of leadership in fostering social cohesion; social

and economic inequalities; the impact of COVID-19 on social cohesion; and the impact of social cohesion on our future economy, justice system, Indigenous reconciliation, the media and policy. In breakout sessions. participants consulted on how they can advance the 'Pathways for Action' that had been identified during 50 roundtables with 500 participants as part of the "Creating an Inclusive Narrative" project held around Australia. The 2022 conference will focus on the themes of diversity and inclusion, consultation and participation, reflecting on how organisations and community groups are putting into action the themes above through initiatives, policy and projects.

Small-Group Discussion Questions Morning session

- In what ways are you learning to engage growing numbers in the process of building a vibrant and socially cohesive society?
- Reflect on the development of society

 Map the distance traversed over the years in relation to the endeavours in which you have been engaged to strengthen social cohesion and inclusion, and link this to the current reality and a vision for the immediate future.

- How can we develop the capacity of increasing numbers of people to contribute to strengthening social cohesion and inclusion?
- What are some of the signs that social transformation is occurring within the groups of people with whom you are engaged?
